Emergency Overview:

CAUTION: Eye and skin irritant. May cause skin sensitization. In case of eye contact, flush eyes with water. Wear gloves and safety glasses. Avoid contact with skin. Use with adequate ventilation. Do not ingest. Keep out of reach of children.

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Eye Contact:

Flush eyes with clean water. If irritation persists, seek medical attention. For direct eye contact, flush with large quantity of water for 15 minutes. Seek medical attention.

Skin Contact:

Remove contaminated clothing; flush skin thoroughly with soap and water. If irritation occurs, seek medical attention.

Inhalation (Breathing):

If irritation of nose or throat develops, move to fresh air. If irritation persists, seek medical attention.

Ingestion (Swallowing):

Drink one or two glasses of milk or water. Do not induce vomiting. If victim is unconscious, place on the left side with head down. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Do not leave victim unattended. Seek medical attention.

Special Precautions: Full protective equipment including self-contained breathing apparatus should be used. Water spray may be used to cool fire exposed container to prevent pressure build-up and possible auto-ignition or rupture.

Unusual Hazards: Keep containers closed. Sealed container can build up pressure and even melt when exposed to high heat. Cool containers with water.

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Spills expected to be small quantities. Collect excess material with absorbants or wipe with dry towels. Wash with a dilute ammonia solution.

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Keep containers cool, dry, and away from sources of ignition. Keep cartridges capped and sealed. Protect from freezing. Use and store this product with adequate ventilation. Avoid inhalation of vapors and personal contact with the product. All containers should be disposed of in an environmentally safe manner and in accordance with governmental regulations.

8. EXPOSURE CONTROLS / PERSONAL PROTECTION

Respiratory Protection and Ventilation Requirements: Use with adequate ventilation to keep vapor concentration below acceptable limits. Observe OSHA standard 29 CFR 1910-94, 1910.107, 1910.108. If ventilation is not adequate, use approved chemical/mechanical filters designed to remove a combination of particulate and organic vapors in open and restricted areas. Use approved airline type respirators or hoods in confined areas. Observe OSHA standard 29 CFR 1910.134.

Protective Gloves: The use of impervious gloves is recommended to prevent skin contact.

Eye Protection: Eye protection is recommended especially if the material is used in ways where it could contact the eyes.

Other Protective Equipment: Use protective cream if skin contact is likely. Remove and wash contaminated clothing before reuse. Discard contaminated shoes.
